Fact Sheet: Measure H Reduces Consumptive Water Use 58.4%

What is consumptive water usage?

Consumptive use of water is a direct or indirect use or application that does not return the water to non-consumptive use, such as a water washing machine, bathroom or dishwasher, returns water to the sewer where it is to be treated and recycled.

How much consumptive water did the Escondido Country Club use?

Based on records provided by City of Escondido staff, the Escondido Country Club used 208,000 gallons of consumptive water per day (gpd).

How much would the proposed phase of Escondido development use?

Based on a report conducted by David Wilson Engineering, an independent engineering firm hired by the City of Escondido, the consumptive water usage of the phase of Escondido would be 69,000 gpd, a 58.4% reduction from the Country Club.

Consumptive Water Reduction

Escondido Country Club	208,000 gpd
Phase of Escondido	69,000 gpd
Water Reduction	58.4%

The phase of Escondido is proposed as a green project with a reduced consumptive water usage. The project plans to use rainoff, recycled water or well water where allowed to decrease potable water use. The new development includes as many as 400 homes and the average daily water use of a new home in Escondido is 400 gpd/home, a 172,000 gpd average. Only 50% of this is consumptive, the remaining 80,000 gpd will be used inside the home and not upon the street curbs. Based on Escondido planning documents of residential generation in the City's sewer and reuse. All of the non-potable use in the project is including toilet, shower and kitchen, and including will be met with other water sources. The average will include from well, surface water, ground water and recycled water. The estimated ground water available above of 160,000 gpd exceeds the estimated need of the project for non-potable water.
